

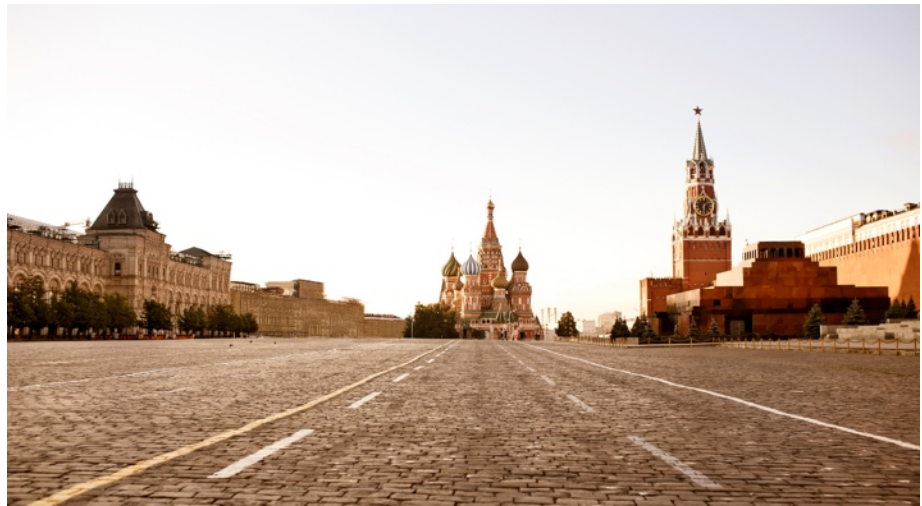

Ushuaia and Antarctica - Now Better Than Ever!

Whenever our tour leaders get together, a favorite topic is suggestions for improving our tour itineraries. I’m always receptive to their suggestions. Most improvements in our tours have resulted from their suggestions.

Beginning with our South American tours in 2014, we’re making changes to the itineraries for our trips to Ushuaia and Antarctica. The trips will begin in Bariloche, Argentina rather than Buenos Aires. Although Buenos Aires is a very popular South American destination, the riding from Bariloche is exciting from the moment riders get on their bikes. Flights to Bariloche (as well as flights from Ushuaia to most parts of the world) require a stop in Buenos Aires. If they wish, riders can visit Buenos Aires on their way to Bariloche, or on their way home from Ushuaia.



We have always used the 5-Star Lao Lao resort whenever we’ve operated trips from Bariloche and we’ll spend two nights of our Ushuaia-bound trips at this great Argentina “landmark”



hotel. Riders are always reluctant to leave Lao Lao, so I’m sure they will enjoy having the opportunity to spend two nights there. This will also provide the opportunity to enjoy the incredible motorcycling near Bariloche, including the popular “Seven Lakes” loop.
