Munich to Istanbul - and Return



As this Waypoints bulletin is being published, the intrepid riders of our 35-day Munich to Istanbul Adventure are enjoying the first week of this exciting trip. This first running of the trip includes eight motorcycles, five of which are couples riding two-up. This international group includes riders from Australia, Germany, Indonesia, Thailand, and even a few from the USA. The group is also noteworthy in that all of the riders on this trip have done multiple trips with us in the past.


The Adventure includes 15 different countries covering approximately 9,500 km (6,000 miles) of exceptional motorcycle travel. From Germany, the tour proceeds through

Austria, Slovenia,

Italy, Croatia, Bosnia & Herzegovina, Montenegro, Albania, Greece, and Turkey. After spending a couple of days in Istanbul, the trip returns to Germany via Bulgaria, Romania, Hungary, Slovakia and Czech Republic with virtually no repetition during the return to Munich.

Our longer Super Tours generally require more advanced planning and budgeting of time and money than our shorter trips. Riders participating in our <u>Munich to Istanbul Adventure</u> began planning the trip as long as 18 months ago.

We'll operate this trip again beginning in May, 2016. If you're interested in this exciting Adventure, it's time to start planning.

If you haven't experienced the "motorcycling paradise" of New Zealand in Spring (September, October and November) you're in for a real treat. Our 13-day New Zealand Top Down Adventure begins November 8, 2014 and there are still spaces available.



We could have named this trip Best of New Zealand, as it incorporates the country's most popular attractions on both of the country's major islands. The Adventure begins on the North Island in Auckland and ends in Christchurch on the South Island, with a wealth of unforgettable experiences in between. You'll ride the stunning roads of the Coromandel Peninsula, visit the North Island's wine country, experience the Maori culture at Rotorua, cross the Cook Strait to the South Island where you'll visit the Fox and Franz Joseph Glaciers, and stop for a night at Mt. Cook before heading for Christchurch.

In addition to great riding and stunning landscapes, the quality of the meals and lodging are in keeping with the high standards that have become an integral part of all Ayres Adventures. Accommodations range from comfortable, middle class hotels to luxury accommodations and "boutique" establishments that are off the usual tourist path. 


California Dreamin' - Or Was I Only Dreaming?
